The 5K Walk/Run is a "friend-raiser" intended to build new community partnerships while helping SVA continue its mission of cultivating young women for college and the workforce.

### **FACTS ABOUT SAINT VINCENT ACADEMY**

- founded in Newark in 1869 and in continual operation since that time.
- sponsored by the Sisters of Charity of Saint Elizabeth.
- a private, Middle States accredited, college-preparatory high school for young women.
- 262 students drawn from Newark and adjacent urban areas.
- 39% are Roman Catholic.
- 72% are eligible for free or reduced lunch through the Federal School Lunch Program, based on incomes as a percentage of federal poverty guidelines.
- average daily attendance is 98%.
- annually, 100% of graduates continue their education after high school. This year, the Class of 2016 earned \$16 million in merit awards and scholarships.
- tuition of \$5,300 in 2016-17 compares with an actual cost per pupil of approximately \$11,000 (Newark public high schools actual cost per pupil in 2014-15 was \$22,013).
- \$8.5 million academic wing, completed in 2004, houses a library/media center, classrooms, offices, a guidance and counseling center, art studio, and gym/auditorium.
- a supportive academic environment is highlighted by an innovative Freshman Program that
  provides students with the skills, self-confidence and discipline to succeed in high school and
  prepare for college.
- a challenging service education program, Students-in-Community, reinforces the importance of community, civic responsibility, and the Gospel value of helping others.
- 13.4% of alumnae actively participate in SVA annual appeals and fundraising efforts. Our goal is to increase this to 20% by January, 2018.
